Guidelines for Mass: 1. The church will regularly be cleaned. 2. **Mandatory:** to wear face mask and sanitize hands. 3. **Toilet is open:** every time after the use clean it using antibacterial wipes and sanitize hands. 4. Single use sheet/newsletter given is to be taken home or left at the exit for disposal. 5. No physical sign of peace, but just a simple bow. 6. Holy Communion given silently **only on hand**, and received silently as well.

Building Works: As you may have noticed some work, as required by health and safety, is going on in and around the church, hall and presbytery. It is our intention to use the ground beside the bus stop to create a memorial garden. We will be putting up new fencing, and will be addressing the issue of the Church roof, both outside and in. In the Hall we have addressed the issues with the electrics and the roof, and we will go onto revitalising the toilets, and creating a new meeting room.

Livestream: Daily Mass will be on livestream (Monday – Friday 10.00am; Saturday 6.30pm and Sunday 10.30am). Those who are not able to come to church for Mass may attend spiritually or on livestream.

Gloria: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
